Spirit rally ties game

Thompson nets game-tying goal

Sometimes a tie can be as important as win.

This was the case when the Stoney Creek Spirit and their Junior C opponents, the Flamboro Gamblers, skated to a 5-5 tie last Saturday night at Stoney Creek Arena.

The contest was a rematch of the Spirit's opener on Sept. 25 when the Gamblers beat Stoney Creek 13-5.

The game started out with both teams hitting, and it was clear from the outset that the game was going to be physical.

Mike Neptune got the Spirit on the scoreboard first near the five minute mark of the first period. Mike Arnold, stationed behind the Flamboro net, passed the puck in front to Neptune who put the puck past Gamblers' netminder Jonathan McDoorlingy.

The Spirit increased their lead a minute later when Mark Mobberley took a pass from behind the net and deposited it into the Flamboro goal to give Stoney Creek a 2-0 advantage.

The Gamblers scored four unanswered goals in the second period to jump out to a 4-2 lead. Chris Crevier opened the Flamboro scoring when his shot from the faceoff circle eluded Spirit goaltender Ray Lippett. Less than a minute later, Lippett stopped Justin Davis' shot, but Kevin Umansky slid the rebound past for a goal.

Paul Talbot and Chris Henderson added the other two second period goals.

The Spirit scored late in the period to narrow the deficit to 4-3 when Eugene Farago passed to Shawn Chrvala

who beat McDoolingy.

Early in the third period, Flamboro took a 5-3 lead when Umansky scored his second goal of the evening, knocking a puck loose in the slot past Lippett.

Stoney Creek rallied with under 10 minutes to play in the contest when Neptune recovered the puck in the Gamblers' zone and fired a shot which trickled under the Flamboro netminder.

Rob Thompson scored the eventual game-tying goal when he snapped a shot past McDoorlingy into the top corner of the net. Lippett and the Stoney Creek defense kept the Gamblers' offense silent for the rest of the game to settle for a 5-5 tie.

The Spirit takes on Dundas Saturday night at the Stoney Creek Arena in a 7:15 p.m. start.
